Office of the Chief Medical Officer

Structure, Functions and Responsibilities

The Health Division will be responsible for research and analysis, policy development, co-ordination of strategy planning, and EU affairs. It will also develop proposals and give direction on the sustainability of Health services. In developing policy and strategy, the Division will plan, lead and maintain an ongoing process of consultation with stakeholders and user involvement.

Responsibilities

- To set up and direct the Health Division and develop the pertinent functions of the directorates within the Division:
- To co-ordinate an ongoing process of consultation with stakeholders and promote user involvement,
- To gather, analyse and disseminate health information and carry out research;
- To develop policy, co-ordinate strategic planning and put forward proposals that contribute to the sustainability of public health and health care services;
- To monitor the implementation of policies, strategic plans, programmes, services and initiatives adopted by the Ministry;
- To co-ordinate and prepare reports identifying issues, problems, unmet needs and service gaps, and recommend initiatives, review of policies, and amendments to procedures and programmes as required;
- To develop pharmaceutical policies and procedures and carry out related audits;
- To co-ordinate and promote EU and International relations;

In addition to the above office of the Chief Medical Officer, the following Departments, Directorates and Units fall under the auspices of the Chief Medical Officer:

- Directorate for Policy Development, EU and International Affairs
- Department of Health Information and Research
- Directorate for Pharmaceutical Affairs
